God is good!

After many years of collective praying, planning, and deliberation, I am happy to announce that the work to return the crucifix to its original and rightful place behind the altar affixed to the sanctuary will soon begin. It is just and right to put it near the altar of Sacrifice to remind us of Christ's paschal mystery and his commandment to carry our cross everyday of our lives. This is also to remind us that just as Christ is at the center of the liturgy, He is also the center of our lives. It is right because it is the norm. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal chapter V, 308 says, "There is to be a cross, with the figure of Christ crucified upon it, either on the altar or near it, where it is clearly visible to the assembled congregation. It is appropriate that such a cross, which calls to mind for the faithful the saving Passion of the Lord, remain near the altar even outside of liturgical celebrations." This is also understood in the U.S. bishops' document, "Built of Living Stones," regarding church furnishings: #91.

It is just because the sanctuary is/was His home. Before the 1982 fire, the Crucifix was on the sanctuary wall behind the altar. Prior to this, in our previous two places of worship, the Crucifix was also behind the altar. (We can see this in the bulletin insert.)

To reiterate, this endeavor to return the Crucifix to its rightful place is the fruit of many years of prayer and reflection. The Parish Planning and Building Committee (PPBC) spent countless hours in meetings, discussions, and deliberations. It took more than five years to finalize the plan. Kudos to the PPBC and to James Gomes the chairperson who worked hard on this project.

We consulted Bishop Larry before the planning started and, then, on January 24th, of this year we presented him our plan. I am pleased to share with you that the Bishop was happy to learn of our plan and very supportive of it. He also gave us some brilliant suggestions on the placement of the Ambo and the presider's chair.

Now that the Sacraments are restored to their original order, this is also the perfect time to return the Crucifix to its original place.

Last Week's Question: Just before the Gospel is read at Mass, those gathered make a brief gesture with their right hand. What is that gesture and why do we make it?

Answer: After the priest or deacon says "The Lord be with you" and "A Reading from the Holy Gospel According to ...," he makes the Sign of The Cross on the Book of The Gospel and then does likewise on his forehead, his lips, and over his heart, saying "May the Words of the Gospel be on my mind, on my lips, and in my heart". The laity and all others attending Mass are invited to make the same gesture and say interiorly a similar prayer so as to be prepared to receive the "Good News" of the Gospel.

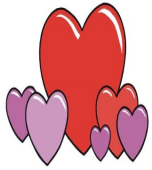
Baptism Class

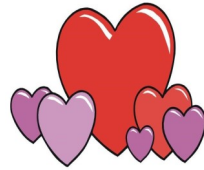
