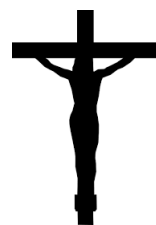

When living in North America, this time of year was so special for me. It was the time when autumn was in all her glory, when the mystical vision of the fall colors filled the landscape. I have to admit it is something I miss.

Every fall at this time because of my decision to leave the North and live in Hawaii, I'm kind of sad because I know I am missing the beauty and wonder of the fall colors. But I never regret giving up those few nice days of fall as compared to living in Hawaii.

In the Gospel, our Lord gives us a much different vision. Multiple times over he refers to Gehenna, that place of "unquenchable fire." It is interesting how my Pilgrimage to Israel helped me to really understand this passage. As we were leaving a certain area of the city of Jerusalem our guide pointed out a valley we saw off to the right. He told us it was called Gehenna. It was the garbage dump for Jerusalem during the time of Jesus. And the garbage was always on fire. They burnt the garbage to help control dreaded diseases. I could just envision the smoke, the smell, and the endless ugliness.

Our Lord uses Gehenna to help us see the ugliness of our existence when we are separated from God's love because of sin.

Jesus came to open the way, to show the way to an eternal existence with God in all his love and glory. His message for us in our gospel is to remind us how deadly sin is; how unrepentant sin robs us of the joy of being joined with God in His love for all eternity.

It reminds us to look deep into our hearts; to look and see what we may find that may cause us to fall into sin. And then decide to "cut it off," to get rid of it.

It is far better to live this life without the luxury or the pleasure we are so attached to that may cause us to fall into sin and face Gehenna. So, "cut it off, let it go." Then, you will be worthy of his grace and share in the life of glory he has prepared for us.

Jesus came for all of us. He came so we may share in God's love for all eternity. Sometimes we must sacrifice a small or short moment of pleasure for a much greater good.

Last Week's Question: What are the "Leonine Prayers"?

Answer: The Leonine Prayers are a set of prayers introduced in 1884 by Pope Leo XIII, who encouraged the faithful to pray them after daily Mass. The Leonine Prayers consist of three Hail Marys, the Salve Regina ("Hail, Holy Queen") and the Prayer to Saint Michael the Archangel ("Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle..."), which Pope Leo himself composed.

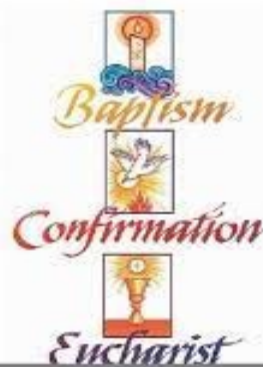
